

Seventy-Five Day Interval

Transition between the Tribulation and the Millennial Reign of Christ

Key Passage: Daniel 12:11-12

"And from the time that the daily sacrifice shall be taken away, and the abomination that maketh desolate set up, there shall be a thousand two hundred and ninety days. Blessed is he that waiteth, and cometh to the thousand three hundred and five and thirty days." Daniel 12:11-12

Days from the Midpoint of the Tribulation:

1,260 days = 3 1/2 years (End of the Great Tribulation)

1,290 days = 3 1/2 years + 30 days (Abomination of Desolation Removed)

1,335 days = 3 1/2 years + 75 days (Inauguration of the Millennial Kingdom)

KEY EVENTS THAT OCCUR DURING THE 75-DAY INTERVAL

I. Removal of the Abomination of Desolation

- The Desecration of the temple is allowed to remain for 30 days after the end of the Tribulation (Dan. 12:11).

II. The Judgment on the Counterfeit Trinity

- The AntiChrist and False Prophet are both cast alive into the Lake of Fire (Rev. 19:20).
- Satan will be cast into the abyss ("the hellish prison" for fallen angels – see 2Pet. 2:4) and bound for 1,000 years (Rev. 20:1-3)

III. The Judgment of the Gentiles

- Those Gentiles who are alive at the end of the Tribulation will be judged in the Valley of Jehoshaphat, the same place where the Campaign of Armageddon ends (Joel 3:1-3).
- The Gentiles will be divided into two camps (the pro-Semitic "sheep" and the anti-Semitic "goats") and judged accordingly (Matt. 25:31-46).

IV. The First Resurrection

- Old Testament saints will be resurrected and rewarded (Dan. 12:2-3).
- Tribulation saints who are killed during the Tribulation will be resurrected and rewarded (Rev. 20:4).
- The first resurrection involves believers only (Rev. 20:5-6).
- The first resurrection involves progressive stages – "each in his own order" (1Cor. 15:20-23).
 - 1) Jesus Christ (1Cor. 15:23)
 - 2) Church saints at the Rapture (1Thess. 4:16-17)
 - 3) Two Witnesses (Rev. 11:11-12)
 - 4) Old Testament Saints (Isa. 26:19; Dan. 12:2)
 - 5) Tribulation Martyrs (Rev. 20:4)

V. The Marriage Feast of the Lamb

- Note Revelation 19:9 as well as the wedding feast parables in Matthew 22:1-14 & Matthew 25:1-13.
